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Millennials Spend Nearly \$400 On Back-to-School, According To New Research

(BPT) - With pencils sharpened and backpacks zipped, American families head back to school facing rising prices. New Empower research finds that 50% of Americans say back-to-school shopping is more expensive this year due to inflation and 31% report feeling stressed about these expenses.

Stress hits hardest for younger generations

Nearly 1 in 3 Americans (31%) report feeling stressed about back-to-school expenses this year, according to new research from Empower. That number climbs sharply among Millennials and Gen Z, where nearly half (43%) say the season comes with financial anxiety.

Nearly 4 in 10 (39%) cite tariffs as a factor making supplies more expensive.

Swiping smart: How families are paying for back-to-school

More than a third of respondents report they’re spending more this year than last year (35%). Americans say they are spending \$188 on back-to-school supplies this season, with younger generations spending the bulk:

- * Millennials: \$394
- * Gen Z: \$276
- * Gen X: \$178
- * Boomers: \$34

To fund these costs, families are turning to a mix of payment strategies:

- * 37% use debit cards or checking accounts
- * 23% rely on credit cards
- * 15% dip into personal savings
- * 7% turn to friends or family
- * 5% opt for buy now, pay later (BNPL) options

One in 5 Millennials say they use BNPL to pay for back-to-school costs (19%).

Early shoppers

Many are getting a head start: 34% of Americans shop for back-to-school items earlier than they used to in order to spread out costs over time (42% Gen Z, 45% Millennials). Nearly 1 in 5 shop in July (16%), with 22% continuing into August.

A third of Americans (34%) have set aside specific savings for back-to-school expenses, a habit more common among younger generations (46% Gen Z; 48% Millennials).

Cutting back to gear up

To make room in their budgets, Americans - especially younger ones - are trimming elsewhere:

- * 42% of Millennials are cutting back in other areas to afford school expenses
- * 51% of Americans say even small purchases now feel like big decisions

What’s in the bag?

Back-to-school spending isn’t just about notebooks and pencils anymore. Here’s where the dollars are going:

- * School supplies (notebooks, backpacks, etc.): 42%
- * Clothing and shoes: 41%
- * Technology: 20%
- * Transportation (bus passes, gas): 17%
- * Extracurriculars (sports, clubs): 13%
- * Childcare/afterschool programs: 7%

Deals, discounts and digital help

In a world where every dollar counts, 74% of shoppers say price and discounts top their decision-making list, followed by quality (56%), brand (30%) and loyalty rewards (26%). More than 4 in 10 (43%) Americans say they wait for a sale or discount before purchasing -

especially Gen Z (54%) and Millennials (52%).

Tech-savvy shoppers are even turning to artificial intelligence:

- * 30% of Millennials have used AI to track down the best deals
- * 27% have used AI to build their school shopping lists

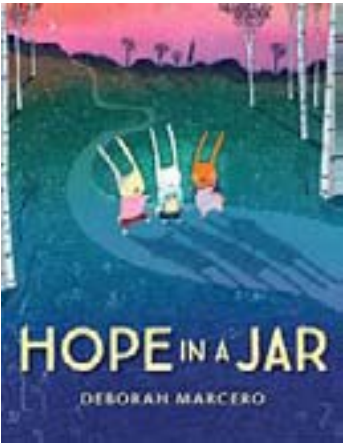

When my daughter was five years old, she came home from preschool talking about germs. Her teachers had clearly made quite an impression, because for a whole week, anytime we asked for a sip of her juice, she would quickly pull her glass away and remind us about “our germs.” Of course, when she wanted a sip of my drink, she conveniently forgot about germs altogether.

One night, while she was enjoying a slice of chocolate cake, I asked for a bite.

“No, Mami! You have germs,” she declared.

I tried to explain. “It’s okay. As long as no one is sick, we can share because we’re family. Our germs get along. They’re like brothers and sisters, we may all have different germs, but they can live happily together in the same house.”

She looked at me with certainty and said, “No, Mami. That’s not right. My teacher said my germs can only be mine.”

Curious, I asked, “Why is that?”

“Because I’m a girl, and my germs are pink!”

I couldn’t help but smile. “If your germs are pink, then what color germs does Papi have?”

“Green,” she answered with a giggle, before launching into a full explanation of the “Germ theory” as she understood it. According to her, girls

have pink germs, boys have orange germs, grandparents have white germs, and Pee Wee, her brother’s kitten, also has pink germs because she likes him.

I asked how she knew all this. “Because my teacher told me,” She said, with absolute conviction.

Her world of pink, green, and orange germs made me pause. What a different place the world would be if everything could be colored by imagination instead of reality.

Children have a way of turning the ordinary into something magical, of seeing possibility where we only see practicality.

Children live in the timelessness of the present. They don’t worry about tomorrow or dwell on yesterday. A swing can carry them into pure joy. A single toy can hold their attention for hours. They are like little mystics, moving effortlessly between the visible and invisible worlds. Where adults brace for storms, children chase rainbows.

As we grow older, life weighs us down with responsibilities and worries, many of which never come to pass. We search for purpose and direction, often forgetting to ask ourselves why we do what we do in the first place. Children, on the other hand, live with instinctive wisdom and a heart full of love.

Pink was my daughter’s favorite color, and I suppose I played a role in that. After two sons, I reveled in frilly

pink dresses and blankets when she was born. Maybe I overdid it. But if she believed her germs were pink, then so be it.

I knew that one day she’d discover that life isn’t made up of the colors we choose. It’s painted in many vivid colors, some bright, some dark, each one part of our story. Looking back, I’m happy I let her live in her sweet pink-germ world.
